We are delighted to welcome you to the 2026 Forus General Assembly in Cambodia! ✦

The **2026 Forus General Assembly** will take place in Siem Reap, Cambodia, from 23 to 27 March 2026, and it is organised in partnership with Forus' national member platform, the Cooperation Committee for Cambodia (CCC).

ABOUT THE FORUS GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The General Assembly (GA) is the highest decision-making body of Forus. It is the key moment when members come together to collectively discuss strategy, finetune activities, and plan for the future.

OBJECTIVES OF THE 2026 GENERAL ASSEMBLY

- Identify and prioritise collective actions to face global challenges.
- Strengthen connections, mutual understanding, and a sense of belonging across the network.
- Share ownership of the 2026–2030 Forus Strategy and discuss the first steps for its implementation.
- Learn, reflect, and exchange about experiences and perspectives from across the network



HYBRID PARTICIPATION

In light of the war in the Middle East and related travel disruptions, the 2026 General Assembly has been adapted to a **hybrid format** to support participation for both onsite and online participants. As of today, we expect about 70 people in person, while others will be joining online.

Join the plenary sessions online: Most plenary sessions will be accessible online via Zoom, with connection details provided in each session description below.

Join dedicated Daily Online Recap & Feedback Sessions: We understand that, due to time zone differences, not all online participants will be able to join every live session. To help support meaningful online participation, Forus will organise dedicated online sessions to reflect together on the day's discussions, exchange views, and raise key points. Main insights from the onsite discussions will be shared in these sessions, and key messages emerging online will in turn be brought back into the wider Assembly conversation. **The Zoom link for each online session is included in the programme for each day.**

Building on Forus’ national, regional, and global leverage, the group will then select 3-4 Influence Bets (plus a short watchlist) that are specific enough to act on, broad enough to unite, and owned across the network.

The session serves as a bridge to Thursday’s World Café labs, where participants will further delve into the advocacy 'bets': what's already being done about it, and how to further, better advance these 'advocacy bets' together as Forus — ensuring the rest of the week moves from shared ambition to coordinated action.

This session brings members together to define shared capacity-strengthening priorities for 2026–2030, to increase the collective impact of national platforms and regional coalitions in a context of growing pressures on civic space.

The session will begin with a short framing and a rapid reflection on the capacities that have most strengthened platforms over the past five years. Participants will then work in small groups to explore common trends and gaps across the network, including areas such as coalition governance, advocacy systems, access to decision-makers, resource mobilisation, organisational safety, and strategic communications.

Building on this shared analysis, groups will identify the core capacities that platforms should strengthen by 2030 to build effective coalitions, advance collective positions, and mitigate risks in increasingly constrained civic spaces. These priorities will then be clustered, discussed, and validated collectively.

This World Café session translates the strategic “power mapping” and influence pathways identified earlier in the week into concrete, practical action for strengthening an enabling environment for civil society. In rotating small groups, members will work across four thematic stations focused on urgent enabling environment challenges (legal restrictions, digital security, funding/partnerships, and countering stigmatizing narratives). Each station will capture actionable ideas grounded in member experience, including the allies/targets to engage, what different regions can contribute, and what support is needed from the Forus network.

The aim is to move from shared “bets” to clear action pathways: what we do, with whom, and with what support in 2026–27. Outputs from the four stations will feed into the overall Influence roadmap for the year ahead.
